Sacraments

Father Tom's Letter

Dear Friends,

In today's gospel, Jesus brings a little child into the midst of his arguing disciples and says whoever receives a child in his name receives him. Fr. Dennis Hamm, SJ, reflects:

At first, this seems to us 20th and 21st century North Americans like an easy invitation. A child is always welcome. But that is not Jesus' point. Those who study the first-century Mediterranean world tell us that children had the lowest status of all in those societies. Being "servant of all" means being servant of the least, of which this child is an example. But then Jesus proceeds to place this serving of the least in the widest possible perspective. When one serves the least, "in Jesus' name," that is, acting explicitly as his disciple, one is also acting out one's relationship with Jesus.

Every three years the Diocese asks those involved in liturgical ministries to make a renewal commitment. I am deeply grateful to all of you who help to build up and serve the Body of Christ. On Saturday morning October 6th, beginning with the 9:15 Mass, Father Kevin Cronin, ofm, will conduct a morning of reflection based on St. Francis of Assisi's experience of hearing the words we hear so clearly today, "Rebuild My Church". This is a required meeting for all who serve as lectors and/or extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist. If your schedule does not permit attending that day, please let the rectory know as soon as possible and we will then set up another session. However, I ask all of us to please try to be there on October 6th. Those involved in music ministry and ushers are strongly encouraged to attend. We will set up a separate session for altar servers shortly after. Of course, the entire parish is most welcome to join in what promises to be a very prayerful, informative and joyful time. The session will last an hour to an hour and a half.

In addition, I would also like to thank all those who minister to our youngest ones in the Children's Liturgy of the Word. It is a delight to see the joy on the children's faces as they return to the assembly every Sunday. Parents, older teens - we can use your help! If you would like to assist in this powerful ministry or find out more about it, please leave your name and number at the rectory. In particular - to our 7 and 8 great students: this might be a very rewarding way in which to get some service hours. If you would like to be considered for this ministry please write me a letter explaining why and how the Word of God shapes your life. In October we will have an orientation session for those who are accepted into this ministry.

Check out too the description of the Barnabas Ministry in today's bulletin. What a wonderful way to encourage our young people to deepen their faith.

Give yourself a treat and come to know Thomas Merton on Monday, September 24th. Dr. Tom Petriano will be giving an informative and engaging presentation. A suggested \$10. offering is welcome. See the details in today's bulletin.

A Note From Father Tom Embarking on a New Catechetical Year

September, 2018

Dear Parents,

There's a line that's always intrigued me, "I pointed out the moon and all you saw was my finger". Obviously, we are not pointing to the moon, but to the Son; and not trying to create either obstacles or difficulties for already busy families. The truth of who we are called to be as a Catholic people is to be formed as a *Eucharistic* people – to let ourselves be **taken** and **blessed** and have new possibilities **broken** open for us.

Last year we began asking for our young people to provide reflections on the Sunday readings they heard when attending Mass. Attendance at our liturgies increased significantly and our SSPJ parish community was greatly enriched!

The overall response to this process was positive. Almost all our catechists, many parents and other parishioners agreed the idea was a good one – but that there were areas that could use some "tweaking". We held an open session last June to address needs and concerns. This letter outlines how the process will proceed this year.

The children will continue to attend Mass weekly and will be given age appropriate materials.

We encourage students in grades 1, 2, and 3 to attend Children's Liturgy of the Word at either the **Saturday 5pm Mass** or the **Sunday 10am Mass**. (For those unable to attend <u>either</u> of these two Masses, a reflection sheet for them may be found on our website and in the bulletin.)

For students in grades 4, 5, and 6, prepared materials will be on our website and, in the bulletin, to bring to any of the weekend Masses.

For students in grades 7 and 8 prepared materials will be on our website and in the bulletin to bring to any of the weekend Masses.

Each month will follow the same pattern:

Week 1 - will focus on what the **Family Prayer Intention** is for the month. These intentions will be part of the offertory procession and mentioned in the Prayer of the Faithful.

Week 2 - will involve an age appropriate **Reflection**, inviting the children to use their imaginations as they place themselves in the gospel story.

Week 3 - will feature a **Puzzle** based on the gospel for the children to complete.

Week 4 - will involve another **Reflection** question related to the readings.

Week 5 (when there is a fifth week) - will include a word jumble or prayer completion to facilitate learning on an age appropriate level.

The reflection activities will begin the weekend of September 29th & 30th, and continue through the school year.

Parents, though you are the primary faith educators of your children, SSPJ parish continues to pray with you and your families, and we look forward to sharing faith with you. Together we will grow as Apostles of Hope!





Reflections on Next Sunday's Scripture Readings

Numbers 11:25-29 Psalm 19 James 5:1-6 Mark 9:38-43,45,47-48

Human nature tends to be judgmental. Sometimes our inclination to judge results in elitism, concluding that others are not worthy of our company. Today's readings make God our model for judging. Whom did God ever leave out of God's love? Who was ever unworthy of God's gifts?

Moses had earlier complained to God that he could not provide for Israel in the desert all by himself. To alleviate the situation, God promised to confer Moses' prophetic spirit on seventy elders. Even though Eldad and Medad were not present in the camp when God conferred Moses' spirit, they still received the gift and began to prophesy. The lesson is that God's ability to share the spirit is not restricted. God is the measure.

The author of James maintains that the rich have mistreated their employees. Since they withheld the wages that were due, their silver and gold will corrode and their garments will fall prey to ravaging moths. The wealthy have not realized that God is the God of the poor, and intercedes on their behalf.

In today's gospel passage, Mark brings together sayings of Jesus. In the first saying, Jesus rejects the elitism of the disciples (verses 39-40); in the second (verse 41), anyone who gives the disciple a drink will belong to Christ; in the third (verse 42), Jesus holds up the little ones as totally dependent on God, whom no one may lead astray. Narrow vision will not capture the kingdom.

Narrow vision impedes our growth in faith. God empowers all people with love. Whom do we fail to see as worthy of our love?

THINGS BEYOND OUR IMAGINATION

(SEPTEMBER 21, 2015)

Recently, at an academic dinner, I was sitting across the table from a nuclear scientist. At one point, I asked him this question: Do you believe that there's human life on other planets? His answer surprised me: "As a scientist, no, I don't believe there's human life on another planet. Scientifically, the odds are strongly against it. But, as a Christian, I believe there's human life on other planets. Why? My logic is this: Why would God chose to have only one child?"

Why would God choose to have only one child? Good logic. Why indeed would an infinite God, capable of creating and loving beyond all imagination, want to do this only once? Why would an infinite God, at a certain point, say: "That's enough. That's my limit. These are all the people I can handle and love! Anything beyond this is too much for me! Now is the time to stop creating and enjoy what I've done."

Put this way, my scientist friend's hunch makes a lot of sense. Given that God is infinite, why would God ever stop doing what God is doing? Why would God favor just us, who have been already been given life, and not give that same gift endlessly to others? By what logic, other than the limits of our own mind, might we posit an end to creation?

We struggle with this because what God has already created, both in terms of the immensity of the universe and the number of people who have been born in history, is already too much for our imagination to grasp. There are billions and billions of planets, with trillions of processes happening on each of these every second. Just on our planet, earth, there are now more than seven billion people living, millions more have lived before us, and many more are being born every second. And inside of each of these persons there is a unique heart and mind caught-up in an infinite and complex array of joys, heartaches, and moral choices. Moreover, all of these trillions of human and cosmic processes have been going on for millions and billions of years. How can we imagine a heart and a mind somewhere that knows and loves and cares intimately about every individual person, every individual joy, every individual heartache, every individual moral choice, and every individual planet, star, and grain of sand, as if it were an only child?

The answer is clear: It cannot be imagined! To try to imagine this is to end up either in atheism or nursing a false concept of God. Any God worth believing in has to be able to know and love beyond human imagination, otherwise the immensity of our universe and the uniqueness of our lives are not being held inside the loving care of anyone's hand and heart.

But how can God know, love, and care for all of this immensity and complexity? Moreover, how will all these billions and billions of people go to heaven, so that all of us end up in one body of love within which we will be in intimate community with each other? That's beyond all imagination, at least in terms of human capacity, but my hunch is that heaven cannot be imagined not because it is too complex but because it is too simple, namely, simple in the way Scholastic philosophy affirms that God is simple: God so embodies and encompasses all complexity so as to constitute a reality too simple to be imagined.

It seems too that the origins of our universe are also too simple to be imagined: Our universe, in so far as we know it, had a beginning and scientists believe (The Big Bang Theory) that everything originated from a single cell of energy too tiny to measure or imagine. This single cell exploded with a force and an energy that is still going on today, still expanding outward and creating billions and billions of planets in its wake. And scientists believe that all of this will come back together again, involute, sometime in a future which will take billions of more years to unfold.

So here's my hunch: Maybe the billions and billions of people, living and dead and still to be born, in both their origins and in their eventual destiny, parallel what has happened and is happening in the origin, expansion, and eventual involution of our universe, that is, just as God is creating billions and billions of planets, God is creating billions and billions of people. And, just as our physical universe will one day come back together again into a single unity, so too will all people come together again in a single community within which God's intimate love for each of us will bring us together and hold us together in a unity too simple to be imagined, except that now that union with God and each other will not be unconscious but will be known and felt in a very heightened, self-conscious gratitude and ecstasy.
