Father Tom's Letter

Dear Friends,

Today we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. Fr. Jude Siciliano, OP, writes:

Jesus' baptism reminds us today that, through our baptism, we are united to him. I dare say that most of us rarely, if ever, think about our baptism. (Do we know the date we were baptized?) Through our baptism we died with Christ and thus have been reborn into a whole new life (Romans 6). We, the baptized, are incorporated into the body of Christ. We are called and enabled to imitate Jesus, whom Paul says, "went about doing good." We don't need a detailed rule book in order to know how we should act in each situation of our lives, for in Baptism, we have the companionship of the Spirit of Jesus who is our wisdom, impulse and help to do good.

Just as Jesus entered the Jordan to be baptized along with the repentant, so he enters our scene of darkness and confinement today. He is the one promised us in the prophet Isaiah, the one who will "bring out prisoners from confinement." He comes to those hidden places that keep us locked up. He goes to the imprisoned areas of our lives and our restricted ways of behaving which we sometimes excuse by saying, "That's just the way I am." Rather than be a cheerleader on the sidelines, Jesus comes down into the waters and into the dark places where we are. He helps us face the shadows and hidden places and leads us out -- just as God promised God would do for us through the prophet Isaiah.

Are we baptized Christians willing to let Jesus enter those "hidden places that keep us locked up"? As he entered a new phase of his life through his baptism, are we, strengthened by our own baptism, willing to move forward into new phases and possibilities in our life? Do we recognize that meaning and power of baptism?

Might part of your baptismal call be an invitation to share a little of your time with our parish Baptism Ministry? Could you assist at one of our welcoming Masses - either a Saturday at the 5:00 mass or on Sunday at the 12:00pm mass- by welcoming parents and their newborns, guiding them to reserved seats, or leading prayers of blessings? Or perhaps you could assist periodically at Baptisms on Sunday afternoons, as greeters or readers or cantors. Have you sewing skills which would enable you to create Baptismal bibs for our young ones? (Pattern and material provided!) All these possibilities can be scheduled around your availability. Please consider these bite-size ways of being an Apostle of Hope in the coming year. Please call the Parish Center for further information.

And speaking of Baptism, how many of you are godparents? What an honor to be asked! This special relationship calls for prayer and nurturing. Let's say a prayer for our godparents and our godchildren today!

Bless Your Door On Epiphany

The Gospel tells us that the Magi found Christ "on entering the house". The door to your home is a holy threshold. You can bless those who come in and go out by inscribing above the door the first two numbers of the year + C + M + B + the last two numbers of the year. Tradition tells us that the letters stand for the names of the Magi; Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. Adolph Adam points out that it may also mean "Christus mansionem benedicat" or "May Christ bless this dwelling". It's appropriate to bless your door in January – janua means "door" and the first month is the door to the new year. Before placing the blessing above your doorway, say this prayer...

God of Bethlehem and Cana, God of Jordan's leaping waters,

In baptism you bring us into your family.

You wed us and embrace us as your beloved.

May we fill this place with kindness to one another, with hospitality to guests, and with abundant care for every stranger.

By the gentle light of a star, guide home all who seek you on paths of faith, hope and love.

Then we will join the angels in proclaiming your praise:

Glory in heaven and peace on earth, now and forever.

It's Not Me, It's Him

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ► Isaiah 49:3, 5-6 The servant of the Lord
- ▶ 1 Corinthians 1:1-3 Greeting to the church
- ► John 1:29-34 John's testimony to Jesus

All four gospels give an account of Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist. This story by the author of John's gospel (who was not the same person as John the Baptist) is perhaps the most puzzling of the four. John speaks in somewhat odd and cryptic language, beginning with "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world."

As Catholics today, we recognize that phrase from mass when the priest holds up the consecrated host. However, readers and hearers of John's Gospel would have understood it as a reference to their Jewish heritage. In Jesus' day, Jews would take a lamb to the Temple in Jerusalem to be sacrificed as an atonement for their sins. When John stated that Jesus was the Lamb of God, he was making quite a claim - that Jesus was taking the place of a sacrificial lamb and that he was taking on the sins of the entire world!

There are suggestions in several of the gospels that some people were beginning to think John the Baptist was the long-awaited Messiah. In this Gospel, John says everything he can to convince people that it isn't him, but Jesus, who deserves that recognition. Clearly, he had a profound experience after baptizing Jesus when the Spirit came "down like a dove from heaven," leaving him without a doubt that Jesus was the Messiah, not him.

The Best Ten Books That Found Me in 2019

There's a Latin axiom which argues that there's no accounting for taste, de gustibus non est disputandum. I reference it as to preamble to my annual list of the ten books I most enjoyed this past year because, admittedly, taste is somewhat subjective. I chose these particular books because they're the ones that spoke most deeply to me. Perhaps they won't speak to you in the same way. Fair enough. There's no accounting for taste.

So, here are the authors and the books that spoke to me most deeply during this past year ...

- 1. **Bernardo Olivera**, *How Far to Follow? The Martyrs of Atlas*. This book helps tell the inside story of the Trappist monks who were martyred by Islamic extremists in Algeria in 1996. Similar to the movie, *Of Gods and Men*, it focuses on the deep struggles these men underwent in making the decision not to leave their monastery and, instead, face martyrdom.
- 2. **Donald Senior**, *Raymond E. Brown and the Catholic Biblical Renewal*. Well-researched and well-written, this is a biography of the renowned scripture scholar, Raymond E. Brown, who stood out both for his scholarship and for his exemplary discipleship and priesthood. The book is more of an intellectual history of Brown than a chronicle of his life. It's interesting too because, by sharing Brown's intellectual history, Senior also highlights the particular theological and ecclesial struggles of Brown's generation. For many of us this will be hauntingly familiar.
- 3. Rachel Held Evans: This past year, scanning book reviews, I discovered the writings of Rachel Held Evans. I cite three of her works here that spoke to me very deeply: Searching for Sunday, Loving, Leaving, and Finding Church; Inspired, Slaying Giants, Walking on Water, and Loving the Bible Again; and A Year of Biblical Womanhood. Rachel grew up a cradle Evangelical with a deep and solid faith, but adulthood brought its own challenges, particularly for someone of her courage and honesty. These books chronicle Rachel's struggle with her religious mother-tongue, her falling out of her faith story, and her particular way of finding her way back in. Her story articulates the struggle of millions. It's an invaluable read, irrespective of one's religious mother-tongue. She's also an exceptionally gifted writer. Sadly, she died in May at the age of 37. We lost a needed religious voice, but what she left us can help many a person sort through his or her religious struggles.
- 4. **Jean Bosco Rutagengwa**, *Love Prevails, One Couple's Story of Faith and Survival in the Rwandan Genocide*. Someone once said that if you want to understand the tragedy of the Second World War you can read a thousand books about it and watch a thousand hours of film or you can read the *Diary of Anne Frank*. This is such a "diary", written inside the horrors of the Rwandan Genocide.
- 5. **Robert Ellsberg**, <u>A Living Gospel</u>, <u>Reading God's Story in Holy Lives</u>. The lives of the saints are our living gospel and Robert Ellsberg is the foremost hagiographer in the English language today. This, wonderfully readable, book teaches us both what hagiography is and why it's important.
- 6. **Margaret Renkl,** *Late Migrations, A Natural History of Love and Loss*. This is a unique kind of book, a poetics of sorts on love, nature, adoration, family life, death, dying, and human resiliency. This is a piece of art.
- 7. **Richard Rohr**, <u>The Universal Christ</u>. This book will challenge you and will, with a sound scriptural theology, challenge mainline theology in its popular conception of both the intent and the scope of the incarnation. An important read.
- 8. **Ruth Burrows**, <u>Before the Living God</u>. This is Ruth Burrows' autobiography. I first read it thirty-two years ago. It moved me then and it moved me even more thirty-two years later. In her story, you will better understand your own story and the movement of God in your life.
- 9. **David Brooks**, *The Second Mountain*, *The Quest for a Moral Life*. Brooks' *Second Mountain* very much corresponds to what spiritual writers like Richard Rohr call *the Second-Half of Life*. Drawing upon his own story and creatively mixing secular and religious perspectives, Brooks lays out a challenging vision of what it means to mature, to move from being the hungry child to becoming the blessing adult. An excellent read.
- 10. Mary Jo Leddy, Why Are We Here, A Meditation on Canada. Not least, a book from a Canadian. Mary Jo Leddy, the Founder and Director of *Romero House* for refugees in Toronto has always been a prophetic voice. In this book, she submits that every country has its "original sin", some primal fault in its origins that now taints its present. For Canada, she argues, it was how it treated its indigenous peoples as it formed itself into a nation. Canada is not unique in having such an "original sin". Every country has it. Everyone should read this book.
